POSITION AVAILABLE: One or more temporary, part-time lecturers for a pool from which instructors may be selected for Fall Quarter 2010, Winter and Spring Quarters 2011.

THE DEPARTMENT: The interdisciplinary Department of Human Development consists of 10 tenure-track faculty and a number of part-time lecturers and offers an undergraduate program leading to the Bachelor's degree to over 400 majors. Curriculum focuses on the development of human beings throughout the lifespan and prepares students to work with people of all ages in a culturally diverse society.

DUTIES OF THE POSITON: Teaching one or more courses in the following areas: behavioral, biological, social, cultural, or experiential approaches to human development; childhood, adolescence, adulthood, or aging; cognitive development, language development, relational contexts of human development, or spiritual development; development of world views and faith; group dynamics; and qualitative/quantitative research methodologies. Teaching assignments at CSU East Bay may include courses at both the Hayward and Concord campuses.

RANK AND SALARY: Lecturer. Salary is dependent upon educational preparation and experience. Subject to budgetary authorization.

DATES OF APPOINTMENT: Fall Quarter instruction begins September 22, 2010; Winter Quarter begins January 3, 2011; and Spring Quarter begins March 28, 2011.

QUALIFICATIONS: Applicants should have strong backgrounds in anthropology, biology, cognitive science, history, linguistics, psychology, sociology, theology, or other disciplines that study human beings. M.A. and evidence of teaching experience, professional growth, and a strong interest in student development are required: Ph.D., Ed.D. or M.D. is preferred. Ability to use Blackboard online instructional system required for some courses.

APPLICATION DEADLINE: Positions open until filled. Applications are considered on a continuous basis and may be submitted throughout the year for upcoming quarters (see dates above). In order to be considered for re-appointment those presently in the pool, whether teaching or not must submit a new letter of application and a current vita along with a portfolio, as specified in the Department's policy on periodic review of part-time lecturers. New applicants must submit a letter of application; a complete and current vita; graduate transcripts; teaching evaluations if available; and three letters of recommendation (or an up-to-date placement file) to:
